## 2022 Exhibition Theme Announcement

MASKED: An exhibition of work by Vermont artists with disabilities

Inclusive Arts Vermont invites established and emerging Vermont artists with disabilities to participate in MASKED, the organization's upcoming visual arts exhibition.

Artists are asked to submit works that represent their interpretation of the theme of MASKED. The theme arose in early moments of the global pandemic, but like many words, "masked" has nuanced and layered meanings. Possibilities for



interpretation could include wearing masks, masking and identity, cultural masks, and so much more. Inclusive Arts Vermont encourages artists to interpret the theme and its meaning as broadly as it takes to inspire their creativity.

MASKED will offer participating artists opportunities to be featured in statewide publicity, build larger audiences for their work, and receive technical assistance in the professional documentation and presentation of their work.

The exhibition will travel statewide through the 2022 calendar year. Tour sites are still in process. If you are a venue interested in showcasing the exhibition, please email <a href="mailto:exhibitions@inclusiveartsvermont.org">exhibitions@inclusiveartsvermont.org</a>.

All exhibition host galleries are physically accessible and the exhibition will provide accessible program and communication features coordinated by Inclusive Arts Vermont. This includes, but is not limited to: verbal descriptions, audio tours, large print, braille, and gallery tours.
