The past year at Inclusive Arts Vermont was one of challenges, growth, and yes, even possibilities during a time of isolation and uncertainty.

While the COVID-19 pandemic originally halted the tour of [ANEW, an exhibition of work by 29 Vermont visual artists with disabilities](#), it was able to resume its tour in the fall of 2020. During its six months stay at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center, the show was viewed by approximately 38,000 individuals. It just finished its final leg of the tour at the T.W. Wood Gallery in Montpelier.



The virtual world we find ourselves in came with the opportunity to rethink and reinvent the way that we engage with you. Because of this, we dreamed up and offered a series of monthly artist talks. These hour-long discussions provided a deep dive into the artists' practice and stories. You can [view those on YouTube](#), and [they're all linked on our website](#).
