Quick Guide to Creating Verbal Descriptions:

- 1. Start with contextual information: title, date, artist/author, medium, dimensions
- 2. Add in the broad to fine detail: shape, style, finer details of color, texture, shapes, brushstrokes, etc.
- 3. Always read all text
- 4. Live: Ask questions to understand what sparks curiosity of the recipient of the description.
