



Social Story for Cycles Family Programs with Tours and Artmaking




I am going to a family art making event at All Souls Unitarian Universalist. Here I will make art and look at art in the art show called, Cycles.



There is more than one way I can enter the building. Some entrances have stairs and others have ramps.




Once I enter the building, I will meet staff from Inclusive Arts Vermont and volunteers from the church. Kirsten is one of the people I will meet.




Other families will be at this event. I may meet kids my own age.





The teaching artist will give a tour. I will learn about some of the art. I can ask questions.




Then I will sit down in a chair or on the floor with the group. The teaching artist will guide me through an art activity.
